

from the December 12 Session Meeting

Pastors Report: SWOT report will be presented to Session on January 9, 2024. Pastor David will be on vacation from January 15-22 and returning to work on January 23. Pastor Paul Roberts will be filling in for him for worship on January 21.

Clerks Report: Motion approved to accept the minutes from the November 14 Session Meeting.

THE TRANSFIGURATION

(Revised & Expanded Previous Lesson)

Study Verses: Matt 17; Mark 9; Luke 9; 2 Pet 1: 17-18

Considering restrictive language and style, how is it possible for the Gospel writers to report an event as magnificent and powerful as the Transfiguration in so brief a narrative? On-the-scene accounts guided them in recording this wonderful historical experience, concisely and with great force. The undeniable evidence of Jesus' identity as the Son of God, the plan of redemption confirmed by Old Testament stalwarts speaking directly with the Lord, and the witness provided by His disciples, set testimony to the truth and glory that is Jesus Christ.

Less than a week after Peter's "Thou art the Christ" confession, Jesus led His inner-circle of Peter, James and John, to high ground on what is believed to be Mt. Herman. The disciples marveled at the presence of Moses and Elijah, both of whom passed from this life in miraculous if not mysterious circumstances. The disciples fulfilled the Mosaic legal requirement for <u>three witnesses</u>. Moses, the law giver, and Elijah, the prophet, brought old covenant reference to the impending sacrifice of Jesus. *The redemptive plan was concluding...the New Testament was dawning...God's Kingdom was drawing near.*

The Greek verb "metamorphoo" best explains a transformation from the inside. Jesus was **transfigured** before them. His face became brilliant as the sun...His clothing white as light. This experience is to be accepted as the spiritual and physical manifestation of God's glory contained within Jesus. It had always been there, but until now concealed so He could take on the mantle, **Son of Man**. The excited disciples gazed upon this wonder as it unfolded, focusing upon the conversation taking place between Jesus, Moses and Elijah. Unable to control his enthusiasm, Peter shouted out his pleasure at being part of it all and offered to build three tabernacles to honor the occasion. Prior to completing his statement a bright cloud overshadowed the group and from its midst a powerful voice drove Peter, James and John down on their faces, abruptly ending the experience. Jesus, now without the Prophets, comforted the fearful disciples. God's voice had been forceful: His message more so. "This is my beloved Son in Whom I am well pleased. Hear ye Him".

Jesus' lesson for the disciples on the downhill trip answered questions and eliminated confusion. He also commanded them not to speak of this day until after the **Resurrection**. They were beginning to grasp the essential sequence and purpose of their Lord's powerful actions.


