## **Esther...Beauty Beyond Skin Deep**

(Revised and Enhanced Previous Lesson)

Study Verses: Esther 1-9

Our wise and sovereign God, through the ages chooses individuals or nations to fulfill His plan and purpose. The good, bad, strong or feeble may be drafted to preserve, protect, correct and restore the essence of His creation. Scriptural evidence abounds, illustrating saving of "the" covenant people; Old Testament promises were for Jews through Abraham followed by the Blood Covenant of Jesus Christ, intended for Jew and Gentile alike! The latter is a more perfect contract supported by the liberating shed blood and resurrection of our Redeemer. Father God will call upon holy angels or loyal servants. Conversely, abhorrent characters or faultless critters become pawns in overcoming evil and shaping circumstances for those who love God and cry out in faith. The Almighty summoned His cherished Son to save a sin-sick world. From glory to disrepute; from power to exhaustion, Jesus prevailed. Ponder Israel, God's rebellious nation, serving as the catalyst for the crucifixion of Jesus Christ. The nation refused to recognize the true Messiah. In God's time, every Jew will kneel before our triumphant Lord.

I encourage earnest students of the Word to enjoy reading the brief, compelling story of Esther. This unique account examines the devious plan of the bitter enemies to exterminate the large population of Hebrew exiles spread over the Persian Empire. Remarkably, the name Jehovah is never stated in the narrative, although His presence is strongly evidenced influencing people in adversity.

### **Who is Who?**

Intent here is to focus on significant characters in this historical drama. Surprisingly, two of these occupy abbreviated amounts of time and space, considering their importance.

\* **King Ahasuerus (Xerxes)** This fifth century B.C. Persian ruler was a classic paradox...antagonist swinging to accommodating, depending on sobriety, provincial domination with perceived support, and quite often self-glorification. Ultimately, his respect and love for Esther, worked for good!

\* **Queen Vashti** Lovely and morally upstanding wife of Ahasuerus, banished for refusing an order to unveil herself to impress royal guests at a luxurious feast.

\* **Haman** Sinister Persian Prime Minister who despised all Jews and cunningly convinced the King to annihilate the entire provincial remnant. Selfish, pompous and power seeking, ugly behavior led to a brutal demise.

\* **Mordecai** Loyal, God fearing Jew, born during the exile to Babylonia, resided in Shushan, the Persian capital. Vital facts: Mordecai was Esther's older cousin and adoptive father, upon her biological father's death; He uncovered an assassination plot by two of the King's eunuch servants. Belatedly, Ahasuerus discovered the great deed upon reading a chronicled account and rewarded Mordecai richly; Teaming with Queen Esther, he set forth the risky plan to undo Haman's extermination and property confiscation conspiracy. God's two...saving multitudes.

\* **Queen Esther** Beautiful, brilliant and brave, she boldly responded to the odds-against effort to save her people. She was positioned to do so by a sequence of events that gave opportunity for loyal Jews to achieve yet another stunning victory to save God's chosen. Enduring joy of the victory is still expressed in the **Feast of Purim**.

Amen... "so be it!"

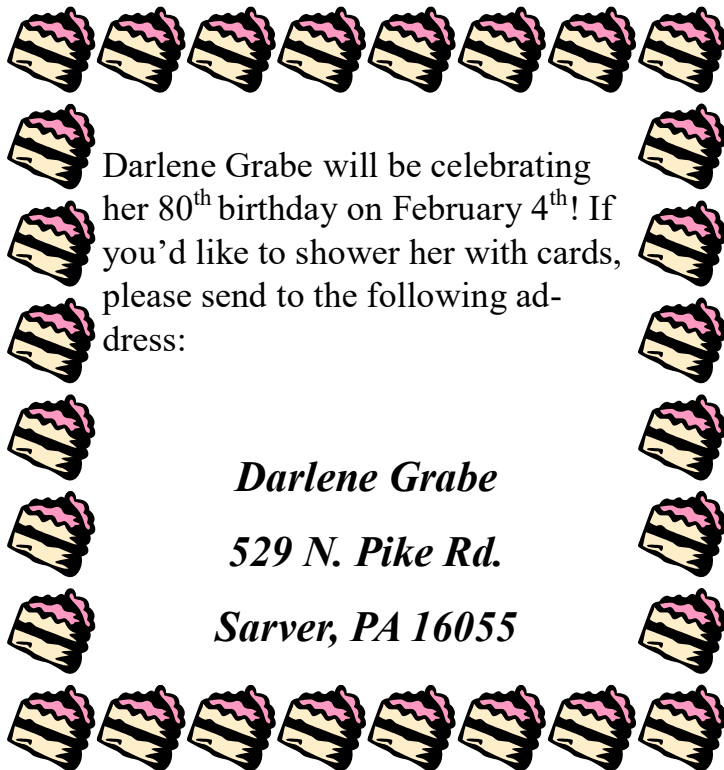

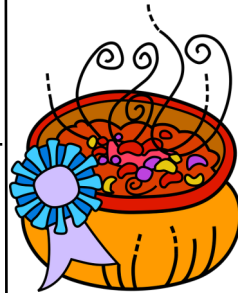

## ***An important note from our Assistant Treasurers at Summit Church:***

Thank you for financially contributing your money to support Summit church, His Kids School, and the missions through your donations this year. Last year, software and hardware failure caused us to update our contribution tracking system. In keeping with our responsibility to do what is best for the church family, we chose not to purchase or use an outside program to track the money given to support our goals. Through the church's Excel program, we were able to create a tracking system that keeps data by name, payment type, date, funds, etc. without additional cost. That information is always available for a donor that wants to know how much he or she gave and where it went.

In keeping with the spirit of stewardship, we also wish to update the way we report donor's annual contribution. We realize that tax laws, electronic banking, and other conveniences have many organizations saving money (and trees) by not sending an itemized statement to each donor. Most nonprofits choose to send just the total annual amount listed on one sheet of paper to donors. Others choose to offer that service if the donor requests it to further reduce unnecessary costs for the church.

**This year we would like you to tell us how to best serve you and the church! You can do this by:**

1. Letting us know in person – Chris Corace, Joanne Huff, Debbie Moyer or Amanda Galvan.
2. Emailing the church listed Stewardship in heading.
3. Phoning the church and leaving a message for the office

If we do not hear from you, we will assume that you do not need a paper statement or will use your bank's website to quickly provide a total of all your check donations. If you prefer, we will provide you with information you request, such as yearly and weekly totals by cash or other payments, the funds that you designated, fund totals, etc. Your bank statements will provide your check number. As always, do not hesitate to contact us as in above if there is an error and we will correct it.

Also, we want to respect our church members' preferences, therefore unless we see a variation on a name on check or envelope, we do not assume that a member is choosing to use another name due to marriage, divorce, and other life changes. Note that we do not keep track of address or phone number changes since that is done through office staff.

**Through God's Love, our church has gone through many changes this year. As we look forward to 2024, the Stewardship volunteers will continue to look for ways to best serve Summit Church and its congregation.**

## Get ready to splash into fun!!

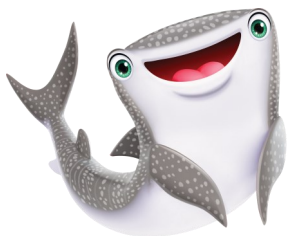

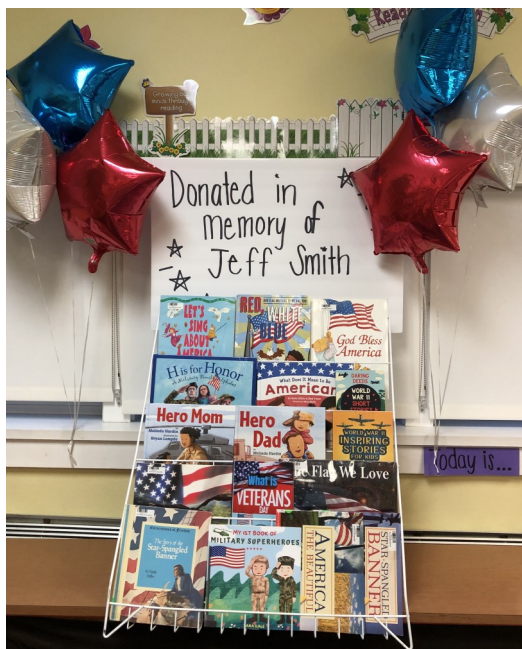

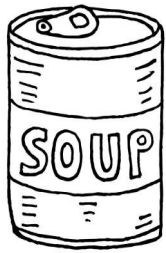
## Upcoming Events at HIS Kids!

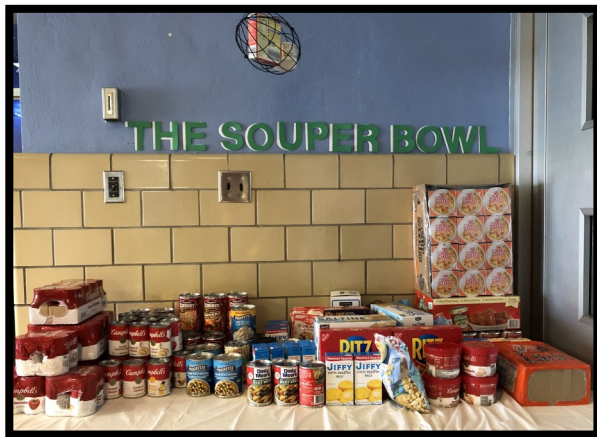


## HIS Kids “Souper” Bowl Update!!

Our HIS Kids family collected 627 items (soup, crackers, corn bread mix, etc)! Wow! That’s 327 more than last year! A big cheer of thanks for all those who brought in items—including some Summit Church friends!

### Are you wondering why such a big jump?



Well let me tell you the story of a pretty amazing 6th grade class, their equally amazing teacher, Mrs. Lisa Nagg, and a hot chocolate stand. Back in December, the students were working on a special project in their class—what would it take to set up and run a hot chocolate stand? They had to figure out what supplies they would need, how much those supplies would cost, how would

they advertise and set up their stand, and finally, what would they do with the profits? They decided their hot chocolate stand would be “open for business” the night of the school’s Christmas program; the hot chocolate would be “sold” for a donation; and where would their earnings go?



### To buy soup and crackers for the school’s “Souper” Bowl service project!!

I told you they were pretty amazing!! They raised \$293.50, which our HIS Kids Boosters graciously matched, for a total of \$587!! Now, how much soup and crackers can that buy?? Yes, they even researched that! They ended up with 418 cans of soup and 29 boxes of crackers!!

These wonderful gifts were given out during our January Food Bank Distribution on January 27— with enough left to give out next month, as well!! Families will now have lots of soup to keep them warm and fed during the cold days ahead.

One of our goals at HIS Kids is to develop students with servant hearts. This is why we have various service projects during the year.




