Parables...Truth in Spoken Pictures

(Revised and Expanded Previous Lesson)

Study Verses: Matt 13, Mark 4: 2-29, Luke 10: 25-27, John 15: 1-8, II Sam 12: 1-4

Synagogue doors were closing behind Jesus' early ministry as the result of mistrust by Jewish leaders and the vile opposition of religious legalists. New places were needed to reach curious if not eager crowds. Jesus would not...could not permit His mission to be impeded. The seashore, hillsides, vine-yards, fields, roadways and private houses became stages for the great message of salvation. The Son of Man, who spoke with great knowledge and authority in strict orthodox settings, was prepared to adjust His teaching style to that of a master storyteller. This change would bring clarity and understanding to Godly principles for common Palestinian Jews, and sometimes the chosen twelve. Jesus taught by *parable*.

Unlike allegories and metaphors, generally speaking, *parables* are intended to convey spiritual or moral truths in brief, "Technicolor" story lines, by way of familiar settings. Jesus would lay His message alongside situations that onlookers lived daily, thus giving substance to every lesson. One point, precisely presented...easily remembered! Virtually every detail is important to allegories; frequently they require considerable thought to comprehend. When reading any of the forty parables printed in the Gospel, it will be helpful to transport yourself back to ancient Palestine, prior to our Lord's crucifixion. In this manner one would see and hear as inhabitants of the region. This mental journey will aid a melting into the Jewish soul, as the sermons of Jesus cry out, "follow me!" The *parable* offers a simple truth, one which genuine hearers could discern and retain. The <u>spoken</u> teachings of Jesus were certain to touch many more lives, as it was unlikely that many in large gatherings were literate. As intended, doubters and cynics could not find a message. Truth was concealed. God's son gave by parable promises of love, trust and compassion from the Almighty. He taught eternal destiny depends on grace not a crushing legal system.

On a Sabbath day, after confronting the Pharisees, Jesus rested on the seashore. Soon a multitude gathered, forcing Him into a boat. From there he preached a story..." THE SOWER OF SEED". That scene may have been playing out in nearby fields. As the narrative unfolds, Jesus contrasts ground conditions in which the seed is contrasted to deep, fertile soil. He concludes with the "who has ears and understands" comment. Later the Disciples questioned Jesus as to why a parable? Explaining that the planted spaces depicted the condition of a man's heart to receive the Word, only those sincerely repentant and open would hold the truth and be fruitful in the faith. This remains the truth today and forever.
