Small Group ministry directs and propels ***Learning from Jesus, and Living for Jesus*** as reflected in our Vision Statement.



DISGUISED WICKEDNESS

A revised and enhanced previous lesson)

Study Verses: Eph 6: 10-20; 1 Pet 5: 5-8

The remarkable C.S. Lewis, who authored so many sophisticated and intellectually challenging Christian books, as well as the immensely popular “Chronicles of Narnia Series, reached rarified air upon publishing “The Screwtape Letters”. I confess to difficulty grasping Lewis’ “Screwtape” mindset. Several abstract paragraphs forced a closer examination to understand the story’s compatibility with the author’s purpose: **show good and evil from the perspective of Satanic organization.** He exposes fiendish perversion and deception that besiege creation and attempt to frustrate God’s plan of redemption through Jesus Christ. Lewis routinely accounts for devilish plans by injecting scriptural thought to verify existence of a diabolic hierarchy. He does so in a serious but surprisingly witty manner. Identifying and discerning our adversary are the crucial first steps in winning the battle...and eventually the war!

The Apostle Paul received his commission and authority directly from Lord Jesus. Upon reading his directives to the early churches, we need remember the profound import and urgency he purposed with every carefully chosen word: “For we wrestle not against flesh and blood”...”Wherefore take unto you the whole armor of God...” Dr. Lewis no doubt had Paul’s letter to the Ephesians etched into his psyche. It is stated that ‘Screwtape Letters and follow-up essay “Screwtape Proposes a Toast” are deadly serious and yet wildly comic. They disturbingly make the case for how the Evil Empire schemes an attack on those they seek to destroy. The two central characters are Screwtape, a well decorated and ranked authority serving “the father below”, and nephew Wormwood, portrayed as a bungling novice demon. Uncle Screwtape, through a series of letters frustratingly guides, instructs and often humiliates the nephew in his effort to “secure damnation” for a select English youth. Relationship aside, Screwtape bullishly recommends various approaches in overcoming the Enemy (Jesus) and His spiritual hold on the subject; most of these are related to temporal matters in the natural world. This provides a home field advantage for evil. Lies and deception are predominant in satanic DNA. Lewis makes a point that the devil’s own, despise truth, they steadfastly lie to mankind and commonly to one another. Spin a lie often enough and it begins to sound correct. Consider market and humanistic solutions to solving mankind’s problems. Isaiah writes: “Woe to those who call evil good, and good evil”.

My most significant “keeper” in a book of many, is a stern thought provoking warning. Many Christians are highly vulnerable to the temptations of hell when feeling personally responsible for faith. God’s protective Shield is neglected and His sharp double-edged Sword (The Word) remains sheathed. Scriptural summary: **Resist the devil and he will flee from you!**


Our Retreat Speaker:

Hello and welcome to another year of third grade!! I want to start off by saying "Thank you" for the dedication of the teachers' service. It was so nice meeting and getting to talk to some of the church members. I think it is always a good idea to bring the church and school together. At school, we have gotten through our first full month and we are in the swing of things. We have already completed our first round of MAP testing. MAP testing helps the teachers see where their students may be struggling or excelling. Teachers use this information to help plan their daily lesson plans and small group times. 
