SIN...UP CLOSE AND PERSONAL

(Revised and Expanded Previous Lesson)

Study Verses: Matt 5: 22; 6; 12-5; Psalm 119: 160; I John 3: 1-15; Romans 1: 32; 5: 21; Eccl 7:29

"Behold what manner of love the Father has bestowed on us, that we should be called children of God," From holy scripture... *Unconditional Love, Sacrificial Love, Personal Love.* "Little children let no one deceive you. He who practices righteousness is religious. He who sins is of the devil, for the devil has sinned from the beginning. For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that he may destroy the works of the devil." John succinctly explains God's determined plan!

We come to Jesus Christ because of compelling need. This need becomes predominate when guilt charges us with crimes against God's moral law. Spiritual certitude and Holy Scripture mercifully warns that rebellious mankind faces an eternity lost in sin. Without grasping the grave consequences of each trespass, why would we ever be concerned with issues of right or wrong? Gospel truth is reduced to myth status by a sin-sick secular world. Adversaries mock Jesus, and for the most part ignore immorality except when exposure threatens their contrived agendas. Godless government leaders and religious extremists brazenly declare what is acceptable behavior. Judo-Christian principles are often violently confronted. Regardless, repentant Christians may live today and face tomorrow with confidence, resting fully upon God's grace. That grace and the true sin solution is found in a Lord and Savior infinitely greater than sin. Christians must always be-at-the-ready to boldly proclaim God's perfect plan of redemption. That is good news!

Mankind was created "morally upright, inclined to do good", provided with free will by the Almighty. Adam and Eve were capable of choice: love God and obey His life sustaining commands or reject them and proceed in rebellion. Sin severely infected the human spirit the moment man fell prey to temptation. Advancing generations continue to suffer from Satan's guile. We are born into transferred sin.

There are those trapped in the deception that if "I" am <u>not</u> guilty of murder, bloody assault, robbing a bank, or stealing my neighbor's car...why should the label "sinner" apply to me? Jesus taught that if we simply harbor thoughts of lust, covetousness, or slander...it is no less a serious moral breach. May anyone then presume they have never sinned in **thought, word or deed?**

New Testament Greek is such a wonderfully explicit language employing terms concisely connoting spiritual principles. Consider five specific words describing **sin** with microscopic clarity.

- * Hamartia...wasted talent, time or opportunity; a missed target
- * Parabasis...crossing over from right to wrong; distorted truth
- * Paratoma...impulsive slipping into evil; caught off guard
- * Anomia...intentionally defy God's law; know right...go wrong
- * Opheilima...failure to fulfill duty; avoid paying debt

"Forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors."

Amen

Vision Teams create the mission statement, define the mission fields, and determine the process and movement of people in the faith community to develop spiritually and to create the movement for people to become disciples of Jesus.

Third, your Vision Team can "Think outside the box". The team can think of new ideas, listen to new ideas, and are willing to risk trying something different – is everything going to work - mostly likely not, however we will learn from those ideas and seek to improve on new ones.

Finally, the Vision team wants to do it right! In discussion with The Church Development Committee of the Presbytery of the Alleghenies, and my Transitional coach, both believe that forming the PNC by July was overly optimistic and stressed the importance of <u>NOT</u> rushing the Visioning process. In explaining this to the Vision Team they completely agreed and stressed that they be allowed to complete the Visioning process. Consequently, the forming of the PNC will be pushed back to allow the Vision team to complete their work.

Exciting things are coming down the line for the Church, HIS Kid's School and our Community.


We discussed the budget and needs. We have been placing yard signs around the community to spread the word and also have more presence on Facebook.




