Why the urgent concern the Church holds for salvation? Why the fuss and bother over what the world considers theological nonsense; by some as religious scare tactic? With countless matters requiring attention, so little time is available for such an "iffy" proposition. An opportunity will surely come available once life settles down! Satan smiles, the casino cashier shouts "place your bet", and your odds to win lower unfavorably. Truths to ponder: life and death is strictly a **Sovereign God** decision. Secondly, **Jehovah-jireh** is the supply-the-every need business. Jesus taught on the Mount... "be anxious for nothing! The Heavenly Father knows the what and when of all our needs. Seek ye first His kingdom and His right-eousness, and all these things shall be added to you". Our Lord expects to be first in each believer's life. God's blessings flow through faith and obedience. Salvation by Grace is life eternal...no greater need! As a lionhearted Bible scholar, C.H. Spurgeon so aptly addresses the **Limited Time...Seek Now Dilemma...** his gentle wording veils a most solemn intent. Spurgeon's generational warnings must be taken seriously from one who spoke out like the old testament prophet from the Book of Hosea... "It is time to seek the Lord".

Spurgeon states in an evening devotion that salvation is priceless; the unsaved should open their hearts to Jesus, as even nature gives warnings to do so now. Young person, contrary to your vitality and exuberance, you may perish before those prime years are reached "...Seek the Lord!" Those hesitant souls who have reached midlife but are now experiencing signs of age..."that hollow cough, that hectic flush are not to be trifled with". The astute pastor is not "crying wolf", but pleading for a surer approach, knowing opportunities to "...Seek the Lord" are not limitless.

Through a composite of quotes, inferences and conclusions, I dutifully offer precious, unrepentant sinners a liberating invitation from Pastor Spurgeon. The season grows shorter with each tick of the clock. Your day of grace is now. Insightfully, the Pastor sat in a quiet chamber and from his midmost soul, spoke as God's fervent messenger. As a brother in Christ's love, I press every soul to heed that call, a private alter call.

The scriptures are crystal "Father God is not willing that any should perish". Come to the saving grace found only in Jesus, our Lord and Savior.






June 25-29, 2023
