The Absolute Purposes of Jesus Christ

(Revised and Expanded Previous Lesson)

## Study <u>Verses: Phil 2: 9-11; Rom 14: 6; 1Cor 12:3; Acts 2: 25-36; Ps 110: 1-2; Gen 14: 18-20; Heb 7: 3, 8:1; 1John 2: 1; 1Pet :5: 8</u>

Sands of time continue to fall, evil and godlessness are determinedly accelerating, just as the Bible warns. Technological development is exploding; hate abounds and mankind increasingly turns to chemical relief. It sounds dire, but there is a way to overcome the world. Jesus, the Messiah, the beloved and anointed Son of God. Identified by many names and possessor of numerous titles, all are forms of worship and praise to project the light of His mission. Yes, Jesus is the Alpha and Omega; yes, Jesus is the Word made flesh; yes, Jesus was the sacrificial Lamb of God and will assuredly return as the Lion of Judah, in power and glory. He was and is everything the Church needs. Permit this lesson to focus upon the embodiment of our salvation, but remembering Jesus' participation with Father God and the Holy Spirit in creation. Is He not also the Good Shepherd, willing to lead, protect, and selflessly lay down His innocent life for those who know and accept Him. All in all, Jesus Christ is love in a sin weary world. The Son of Man's work on earth is perfect and complete. It will persevere to win lost, precious souls.

**LORD OF LORDS** This office of *supreme authority is* conveyed by the Father to exalt Jesus Christ upon His crucifixion, death and resurrection. "A name above every name...one to which every knee in heaven, on or under the earth should bow, and that every tongue should confess Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father". We are accepted by God as apostles, just as He received the law fulfilling Son of Man!

<u>ADVOCATE</u> During his desperate remaining time, our adversary Satan, accuses believers before GOD in heaven, day and night. It is written..."If anyone sins, we have an Advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous". Jesus, our risen Savior and the Holy Spirit, God's power unto salvation, form an overwhelming Defense Counsel, refuting the bent-on-hell prosecution of pure evil. 




### The partnership of HIS Kids Christian School and Sylvania Conservation Foundation

We have access to hundreds of acres of land to hike, trail cams to observe wildlife, honey to harvest from our bee boxes, a fire pit area, pavilion to picnic in and full access to all nature has to offer. Aside from the amazing autumn foliage that is now in its full glory, the property has seen lots of changes over the last few months.


When you enter, you will see new split rail fencing all around the grounds. The entrance has a new sign at both the intersection of 308 and Renick Road and the gate to the property on Mack Road. The open "gate" policy will allow friends and family of HIS Kids to visit anytime and enjoy the fall splendor.


In addition to the new signage at the entrance, there are also additional signs marking the bee boxes, trails and camping spots. New split rail fencing has been installed around the parking lot, camping spots and along the trails. A small kitchen has been added to allow an area to host events. Everything has a fresh coat of paint. There is even a new handicap accessible sidewalk added to make flying planes easier. There are now 3 permanent pilot stations too! Adorning the trees and fence posts, you will see our homemade bird houses made by HKCS students. There are new plants and a stone commemorating the founder.
